Weather: Dry but gale force winds

This walk replaced the normal Friday walk as we were supporting Tara's Franklin's Star (Danny) Charity to raise awareness and money for Brain Tumour Research.

This was originally scheduled as a walk up Snowdon via The Llanberis Path, however due to a dire weather forecast for Snowdonia, above 500m winds of 50 mph gusting to 80 mph the Leader, in conjunction with Tara, made the decision on Friday to switch the walk to Moel Famau.

There was a lot of frigging and re-jigging to do as people were added in and pulled out right up to the last minute. Setting out from Bunbury at the leisurely hour of 9.30 we made the short drive to the car park at Penbarra. We decided to wait a little longer until 11.15 to catch any stragglers. Rounding them all up we placed Bob as the sweeper at the rear to ensure we didn't lose anyone, which worked to perfection.

We set off up the road to Bwlch Penbarra where, once out of the shelter of the trees, the full force of the wind was felt by all. We turned right onto Offa's Dyke heading for Moel Famau in an ever strengthening wind, but at least is wasn't raining. This big broad path, on which even Colin could not get lost (?) leads to the enormous Jubilee Tower that adorns the summit of Moel Famau. By this time the whole squad was strung out along the path, sweeper essential, and as they arrived in dribs and drabs

they fought there way onto the top and a bit of shelter in the strongly gusting wind. We hunkered down awaiting the last of the squad, Bob the sweeper managed to sweep up a couple who were not even in our Group!
