Trip report: Disney and Gritstone Trail

Refreshments were taken near the Bow Stones, those weathered remnants of Saxon Crosses, with great views of the Moor above and of Lyme Park below.

We carried on to the Moor, turning West and eventually dropping down, taking lunch near a disused quarry. Afterwards we entered Hase Bank Woods before reaching Lyme Park. After a short stop, including ice cream for some, we set off for the final push up and across to The Cage, before returning to Disley.
